Chelan County Fair

Our Club has had a booth at the Fair for a couple decades. Before that, many of you know the Club put on a Gem and Mineral Show at the National Guard Armory during Apple Blossom. Times have changed and 5th graders no longer get a school field trip to see the crafts of our hobby. But the Fair does give us the opportunity to share as we hand out polished rocks and jewelry to kids and display our special collections to Fair visitors. We need volunteers to be hosts during the Fair dates and we need polished rocks to give to kids. There are 4-hour time slots open Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Please give me a call (253.318.6616) if you can help. I am also collecting polished rocks for our give-aways. You can bring them to the Picnic or I can pick them up from your home. The other two aspects of our booth are the displays and the exhibits. We have 8 display cases with 4 of those already committed. Call me if you have a collection to share. The displays are set up Wednesday, Sept 6 between 8 am and 9 pm and must be removed Sunday, September 10 after 5 pm. Finally, we need our exhibit case filled with your craft work to be judged. Each piece will be evaluated on its own workmanship and appeal. You may enter up to 4 pieces in each category. Each piece will be awarded a ribbon (blue, red, white) and each ribbon is worth cash so the more you enter the more cash you will get to spend on more rocks later. There are 7 Classes with 8 to 10 categories in each Class:

Class A Cabbed or faceted stone in your own setting Class B Cabbed or faceted stone in a commercial setting Class C Tumbled stone in your own or commercial setting Class D Jewel set – 4 or more stones ready to be set Class E Other i.e. book ends, carvings, clocks, etc Special Collections i.e. fossils, minerals, crystals, etc Class F

Exhibit entries will be accepted from 8 am to 6 pm Wednesday, Sept. 6 and judged that evening.


