### The Move – David's Note




# It's a good time to sign up for Community Rewards with Fred Meyer by Marcia Summers

- 1. Go to www.fredmeyer.com

- 3. Enter log in and password.
- 4. Find My Account under your name and click
- 5. On the left side scroll down to the Community Rewards section.
